1. WHEREAS, the Supervisor has reported to the Board of Trustees that a petition had been filed by owners of the lakefront lots fronting on proposed maintained portions of North Pointe Shores Drive, a private road, approximately 3.5 miles in length in the Township of Alpena, Town 30 North, Range 9 East, lying in Sections 20, 28, 29, and 33, described approximately as follows:

Commencing approximately at the Northwest corner of the Northeast 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 20, being the shoulder of the right-of-way of the Misery Bay Road, thence running in Southwesterly directions to Section 29, then near the lake shore in a Southeasterly direction to the Southeasterly corner of Section 28 and Northeasterly corner of Section 33, then to the gate located at approximately 45°02'44.10" North latitude and 83°20'39.72" West longitude;

to conduct an annual snow removal, grading, and maintenance and improvement program including, but not limited to, grading and graveling, and specially assess the cost thereof to the benefitting lakefront property owners, all in accordance with Act 188 of the Public Acts of 1954, being MCL 41.721 *et seq.*; and,

- 2. WHEREAS, the Supervisor has certified that he has reviewed the names of petitioning lakefront property owners along the above described private road and within the proposed special assessment district and has found that the petitioning lakefront property owners own, in total, more than 50% of the road frontage on the above described private road within the proposed special assessment district; and

WHEREAS, the petition does grant to this Board the authority to establish a special assessment district to conduct an annual snow removal, grading, and maintenance and improvement program, including, but not limited to, grading and graveling, and to assess the benefitting property owners for the cost of the annual program; and

- 3. That a description of the annual snow removal, grading, and maintenance and improvement program, including, but not limited to, grading and graveling, together

with the estimated cost thereof, be filed with the Clerk for public examination during the Clerk's regular business hours.

- 4. That attached hereto as Appendix A is a description of the proposed assessment district, and that the special assessment district would be known as the North Pointe Shores Drive Special Assessment District.
- 5. That a hearing on any objection to or comments in support of the petition, the annual snow removal, grading, and maintenance and improvement program, including, but not limited to, grading and graveling, and the special assessment district proposed to be established for the assessment of the cost of the program, shall be held on April 24, 2023, at a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Alpena at the Alpena Township Hall at 4385 US-23 North, Alpena, Michigan, at 6:00 PM.
- 6. Motor Vehicle Driving Policy

I. PURPOSE

To assure that employee drivers of **Charter Township of Alpena** maintain a current valid Michigan operator's license and operate vehicles in a safe and lawful manner in compliance with the laws of the State of Michigan.

II. DEFINITIONS

The term "employee driver(s)" shall mean any and all paid or unpaid employees, applicants for employment, volunteers and other persons who may be required or permitted to operate any motor vehicle while performing that person's duties on behalf of the Charter Township of Alpena.

III. OPERATOR'S LICENSES

- A. Each employee driver of the **Charter Township of Alpena** shall at all times maintain a current valid Michigan operator's license. Any employee driver failing to maintain a current valid operator's license shall be prohibited from operating any motor vehicle while performing any duties on behalf of the **Charter Township of Alpena**.
- B. Any employee driver whose operator's license is suspended, revoked or otherwise invalid is immediately prohibited from operating any vehicle while performing that person's duties on behalf of the **Charter Township of Alpena**. Each employee driver shall immediately notify his/her immediate supervisor if his/her operator's license has been suspended, revoked or become invalid in any way. Each employee driver is responsible for knowing the status of his/her operator's license.
- C. In order to ensure compliance with the foregoing requirements, each employee driver shall provide to the **Charter Township of Alpena** designated representative a copy of his/her operator's license and shall further execute at least once per year and more frequently as required by the **Charter Township of Alpena**, Consent for Driver's License Record Check. It shall be the responsibility of the Department Head to obtain and review a Michigan Motor Vehicles driver's license abstract for each applicant for employment for an employee driver position. It shall further be the responsibility of the Township Supervisor or Clerk to obtain and review an Michigan Motor Vehicles driver's license abstract for all existing employee drivers at least one time per calendar year.

IV. DUTY TO OPERATE SAFELY AND LEGALLY

Each employee driver is required to operate motor vehicles in a safe and legal manner whether on or off duty with the **Charter Township of Alpena**. This includes the use of seatbelts by all employee drivers and their passengers at all times required by law and compliance with any restrictions on the employee driver's operator's license. Any employee who is found guilty or pays bond forfeiture on an offense for which points may be charged under 140 IAC 1-4.5-10 shall immediately report that fact to the Township Supervisor or Clerk. This requirement shall apply to all offenses described above regardless of whether the offense is committed while the employee driver is on or off duty with the **Charter Township of Alpena**.

V. OPERATION UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF SUBSTANCES, DISTRACTED DRIVING AND OTHER UNSAFE PRACTICES

Employee drivers shall not operate any motor vehicle while performing duties on behalf of the **Charter Township of Alpena** while impaired due to alcohol, prescription or nonprescription drugs or any other legal or illegal substance(s). Employee drivers shall not at any time engage in any activities that distract their attention from the operation of any motor vehicles while performing duties on behalf of the **Charter Township of Alpena**. This shall include but not be limited to the use of cellular telephones, computers, electronic navigation devices and/or text messaging devices.

VI. ACCIDENT REPORTS

An employee driver involved in a motor vehicle accident while performing duties on behalf of the **Charter Township of Alpena** shall cooperate in the filing of all law enforcement reports required by law and, in addition, shall immediately inform his/her supervisor and complete a full and accurate report on the form prescribed by the **Charter Township of Alpena**.

VII. DISCIPLINE

The failure to comply with any of the foregoing requirements, a conviction or payment of a bond forfeiture as described above and/or the imposition of a driving prohibition as described above may result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to, placement on restricted duty, administrative leave, suspension or termination.

POLICY: DRIVING RECORD REVIEW

PURPOSE

1) To assure that employees of Charter Township of Alpena maintain a current unrestricted driver license in accordance with this policy.

GENERAL

- Each employee of Charter Township of Alpena shall at all times maintain a current unrestricted driver license while operating a municipal and/or any personal vehicle on behalf of Charter Township of Alpena.
- 2) Any employee whose driver license is suspended, revoked, or restricted is immediately prohibited from operating any municipal or personal vehicle on behalf of Charter Township of Alpena. Each employee shall immediately notify Charter Township of Alpena administration if their driver license has been suspended, revoked, or restricted in any way. Each employee is responsible for knowing the status of his/her driver license.
- 3) A change in status of a license restriction may result in a driving status change or possible suspension and/or termination from Charter Township of Alpena.

MISDEMEANOR VIOLATIONS

- 1) Any employee of Charter Township of Alpena convicted of a violation shall be automatically suspended from driving municipal vehicles or a personal vehicle while operating on behalf of Charter Township of Alpena. In addition, any such employee shall also be required to attend an approved driver improvement program or equivalent training and be certified to operate emergency vehicles.
 - a) "Misdemeanor Violations" referred to in this policy include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - i) Operating while intoxicated
 - ii) Operating under the influence of a controlled substance
 - iii) Operating during a period of suspension or revocation
 - iv) Reckless driving
 - v) Leaving the scene of an accident

CIVIL INFRACTIONS

 Any employee who receives a civil infraction moving violation on their driving record may be prohibited from operating their personal vehicles on behalf of Charter Township of Alpena or from driving any Charter Township of Alpena municipally owned vehicles. The suspension may expire after review by Charter Township of Alpena administration.

POLICY: DRIVING RECORD REVIEW

COMPLAINTS

- 1) Charter Township of Alpena administration may change the driving status of personnel based on driving complaints, driving ability, or upon recommendation of local law enforcement.
- 2) A written complaint received by Charter Township of Alpena shall be investigated and become a part of the employee's personnel file. The employee shall also be notified of the complaint.
- 3) A valid complaint filed against an employee of Charter Township of Alpena may invoke a restriction on driving municipal owned vehicles or personal vehicles on behalf of Charter Township of Alpena and may also result in suspension from Charter Township of Alpena for a period of time set by Charter Township of Alpena administration.

VEHICLE USE POLICY

(All Charter Township of Alpena employees permitted to drive municipal owned vehicles must provide a copy of their valid Secretary of State Operator's License record.)

Generally, only Charter Township of Alpena employees, members of the governing board, members of boards and committees appointed by the boards engaged in the transportation of Township personnel and/or material and supplies used to carry out the functions and operations of the departments of the Township, and for which the immediate use of a vehicle is actually necessary or convenient, shall drive, ride, or be transported in Township-owned vehicles.

The following are exceptions to that general policy:

- (1) In emergencies where the Township employee has a reasonable belief, based on a totality of circumstances, that the life, safety, health or physical welfare of a citizen would be immediately threatened without the security and/or transportation the Township-owned vehicle could provide him or her. Examples of such emergencies include, but are not limited to, accidents involving personal injury, acute illness and actual and potential victims of crime and violence.
- (2) In motorist/passenger assistance where there is no immediate emergency but, under a totality of circumstances, the Township employee has a reasonable belief that the failure to transport the motorist and/or passengers in a Township-owned vehicle could result in such persons being left in real or potentially real danger, or would result in extreme inconvenience to them. The use of a Township-owned vehicle in such cases shall be limited to transporting motorists and their passengers only to those places where they are reasonably safe and have a reasonable opportunity to obtain continued help without further conveyance in the Township-owned vehicle.
- (3) Among the circumstances Township employees shall consider in determining whether to transport a private person in a non-emergency Township-owned vehicles under the emergency and motorist/passenger assistance exceptions is whether a more appropriate vehicle manned by trained police or other emergency personnel is reasonably available. Township employees should not generally undertake the transportation of persons with severe injuries and illnesses.

- (4) When it is necessary for reasons of inclement weather, late hour, lack of transportation or other reasonable cause, to transport non-Township personnel to and from Township-owned property, so that such personnel can install, repair or maintain Township equipment essential to the continuation or restoration of public services essential to the safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the Township.
- (5) When the vehicle is being driven to or picked up from private maintenance or repair facilities, and while it is being "road-tested" while in the possession of such facilities.
- (6) Township employees who are assigned and required to drive Township vehicles are not permitted to carry non-employees as passengers.

Individual operating departments of the Township may make more stringent regulations regarding the use of marked, specially equipped vehicles. These regulations shall be in writing and distributed to those employees assigned such units. Any regulations prepared under this paragraph are subject to the review and approval of the Township Supervisor.

Township-owned vehicles, under both the Policies and Procedures Manual and its exceptions, shall not ordinarily be taken outside the Township, except in the conduct of Township business. The Township Supervisor or department heads shall have the authority to grant exceptions to this policy, to the extent that such exceptions are for legitimate and necessary Township business. Reports of such travel shall be made to the employee's department head the first working day following such travel. Exceptions cannot be self-granted and must follow the chain of command (eg. Board of Trustees). The report shall include the purpose, duration and distance of the travel outside the Township, and any other information the department head requires to make a determination that the travel conformed to this policy. The department head shall keep a permanent file of such reports.

Employees given permission to use a Township vehicle shall ensure that the vehicle and any attached equipment are secured to prevent usage by unauthorized personnel. Keys and other devices shall be secured to prevent access by unauthorized personnel.

All Township employees, shall wear shoulder and lap restraints at all times while operating or riding in Township vehicles.

All Township vehicles shall obey all traffic laws and other safety precautions as provided by the Charter Township of Alpena. All moving violations shall be reported to the Township Supervisor.

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

I. PURPOSE

To prohibit the inappropriate use of electronic communication systems, media imaging systems, networks, devices, and equipment and dissemination of inappropriate information, images, recordings, photographs or other materials by municipal personnel. This includes the use of social media. Social media is broadly defined as internet-based communications technology that provides immediacy, interactivity and the sharing of information across multiple platforms.

The municipality allows the use of social media, where appropriate, to further the goals and missions of the municipality. However, the municipality has an overriding interest and expectation in deciding what is "spoken" on behalf of the municipality through social media. This policy establishes guidelines for the use of social media by municipality Employees.

II. APPLICABILITY

This policy applies to all municipal Employees and approved volunteers, consultants, service providers and contractors performing business on behalf of municipality ("Employees").

III. POLICY

It is the policy of the municipality that all individuals identified in paragraph II abide by the policy set forth herein when using municipal information systems, which are defined as: computers and the services of both internal and external databases and information exchange networks, the internet, email, voice mail, mobile data terminals, facsimile machines, mobile telephones, lap top computers and social media ("Information Systems").

Communications sent by email may be subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act or in litigation. No Employee shall have any expectation of privacy with regard to any information transmitted or stored on the municipality's Information Systems.

IV. PROCEDURE

- A. Transmission of electronic messages and information on communications media provided for Employees of the municipality shall be treated with the same degree of propriety, professionalism and confidentiality as official written correspondence or public records.
- B. The municipality encourages authorized and trained personnel with access to municipal Information Systems to utilize these devices whenever necessary. However, all Information Systems are the property of the municipality and use of any of these Information Systems is a privilege that is subject to revocation. Information Systems are intended for use in conducting official municipal business with limited exceptions noted in this policy
- C. Employees are advised that they do not maintain any right to privacy or ownership in Information Systems equipment or its contents and shall not install or download personally owned software.
- D. The municipality's administration reserves the right to access any of the records within the Information Systems at any time and to retain or dispose of those records as it deems necessary and appropriate, and may require employees to provide passwords to files that have been encrypted or password protected.
- E. The municipality reserves the right to access, for quality control purposes and/or for violations of this policy, date, electronic and voice transmissions of Employees conducting business in the municipality.
- F. Personal and/or private use of municipal Information Systems to access social media sites is prohibited.
- G. Accessing or transmitting materials from municipal Information Systems that involve the use of obscene language, images, jokes, sexually explicit materials, or messages that disparage or threaten the municipality, any person, group, or classification of individuals is prohibited regardless of whether the recipient has consented to or requested such materials.
- H. Confidential, proprietary or sensitive information may be disseminated or made available through shared directories or networked systems only to individuals with a need and a right to know and when there is sufficient assurance that appropriate security of such information will be maintained. The dissemination of confidential, proprietary or sensitive information, including photographs, on social media sites or personal web pages is prohibited.

- No Employee shall access or allow others to access any file or database of the municipality unless that person has a need and a right to such information. Personal identification and access codes shall not be revealed to any unauthorized source.
- J. Employees are not to open email messages unless they are certain of the trustworthiness of the source.
- K. Employees may not utilize email messages as a secure and confidential means of communication since subsequent direction of the message cannot be controlled.
- L. Employees may not knowingly accept messages with inappropriate content as described in the policy and will immediately report it to their supervisor and then completely delete any such message inadvertently received when directed to do so.
- M. Creating a web site or social media page that has any appearance of officially representing the municipality is prohibited without the express written approval of the Municipal Board or designee. Any information added to the official municipal web page(s) or site(s) must have the written approval of the Municipal Board or designee prior to being accessible by the general public.
- N. Using images of any official municipal logo, patch, badge or sign on personal web pages is prohibited without the express written approval of the Municipal Board or designee.
- O. Employees shall not utilize Information Systems to spoof, masquerade or assume any identity or credentials of another individual.
- P. The use of social media shall conform to all municipal policies prohibiting discrimination, retaliation and harassment of co-workers.
- Q. Employees shall not identify themselves or any co-worker specifically, or otherwise infer in any way that their statements, misleading or otherwise represent the municipality on any social media site.

V. DISCIPLINE

Any violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.
